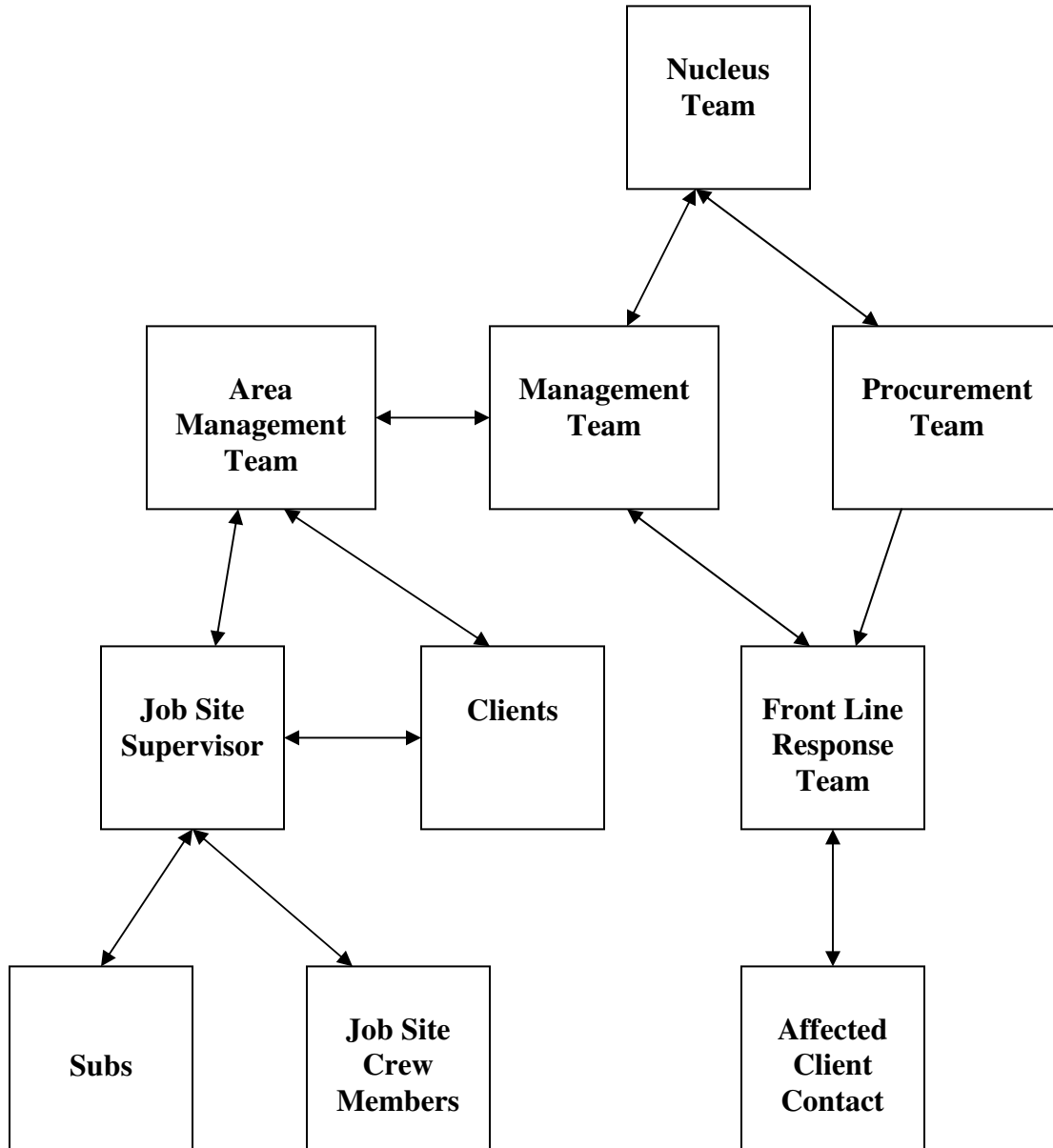

Hurricane Preparedness Plan 2011

Hurricane season is upon us and it is time to review and revise our hurricane preparedness plan. Milton J. Wood realizes our offices' proximity to the ocean makes our buildings vulnerable to the inclement weather. Due to this factor alone, we need to have a plan in place to counteract these vulnerabilities.

Milton J. Wood also has a responsibility to our clients and has committed to be a resource to them should a hurricane affect their operations.

Before we explain this proposed plan of action we would like to review important hurricane related terms and definitions for everyone to be familiar with, during this time of year.

- *Hurricane Watch: A formal advisory issued by forecasters at the National Hurricane Center (NHC) when they have determined that hurricane conditions are a potential threat in a coastal area or group of islands within a 24 to 36 hour period. A watch is used to inform the public and marine interests of the storm's location, intensity, and movement.*
- *Hurricane Warning: A formal advisory issued by forecasters at the National Hurricane Center when they have determined that hurricane conditions are expected in a coastal area or group of islands within a 24 hour period. A warning is used to inform the public and marine interests of the storm's location, intensity and movement.*
- *Category 1 (Minimal) Winds 74-95 mph – Surge 4-5 feet
Damage primarily restricted to shrubbery, trees and unanchored mobile homes; no substantial damage to other structures; some damage to poorly constructed signs, low lying roads inundated; minor damage to piers, small craft in exposed anchorage torn from moorings.*
- *Category 2 (Moderate) Winds 96-110 mph – Surge 6-8 feet
 - *Considerable damage to shrubbery and tree foliage, some trees blown down; major damage to exposed mobile homes; extensive damage to poorly constructed signs and some damage to windows, doors, and roofing materials of buildings, but no major destruction to buildings.*
 - *Coastal roads and low lying escape routes inland may be cut off by rising water about 2 to 4 hours before landfall; considerable damage to piers and marinas flooded; small craft in protected anchorage torn from moorings.*
 - *Evacuation of some shoreline residences and low-lying areas required.**



- Category 3 (Extensive) Winds 111-130 mph – Surge 9-12 feet
 - *Foliage torn from trees; large trees blown down; poorly constructed signs blown down; some damage to roofing, windows, and doors; some structural damage to small buildings; mobile homes destroyed.*
 - *Serious flooding along the coast; many small structures near the coast destroyed; larger coastal structures damaged by battering waves and floating debris.*
 - *Low lying escape routes inland cut off by rising water about 3 to 5 hours before landfall; flat terrain 5 feet or less above sea level flooded up to 8 or more miles inland.*
 - *Evacuation of low-lying residences within several blocks of shoreline may be required.*

- Category 4 (Extreme) Winds 131-155 mph – Surge 13-18 feet
 - *Shrubs, trees and all signs blown down; extensive damage to roofs, windows and doors, with complete failure of roofs on many smaller residences; mobile homes demolished.*
 - *Flat terrain 10 feet or less above sea level flooded inland as far as 6 miles; flooding and battering by waves and floating debris causing major damage to lower floors of structures near the shore; low lying escape routes inland cut off by rising water about 3 to 5 hours before landfall; major erosion of beaches.*
 - *Massive evacuation of all residences within 500 yards of the shore may be required, as well as of single story residences in low ground within 2 miles of the shore.*

- Category 5 (Catastrophic) Winds greater than 155 mph–Surge greater than 18'
 - *Trees, shrub, and all signs blown down; considerable damage to roofs and buildings, with very severe and extensive damage to windows and doors; complete failure on many roofs of residences and industrial buildings; extensive shattering of glass in windows; complete buildings destroyed; small buildings overturned or blown away; mobile homes demolished*
 - *Major damage to lower floors of all structures less than 15 feet above sea level with 1500 feet of shoreline.*
 - *Low lying escape routes inland cut off by rising water about 3 to 5 hours before landfall; major erosion of beaches.*
 - *Massive evacuation of residential areas on low ground within 5 to 10 miles of the shore may be required.*



Pre Hurricane Season

Although hurricane season officially begins June 1st, preparation for the hurricane season must be started long before. Clients must be contacted and letters of representation updated. Emergency contact lists and employee assignments must be reviewed and adjusted as necessary.

As the Equipment Manager and Procurement Team Leader, Jim Duncan is responsible for securing the areas where we own property. All trees should be cut back to minimize the danger of strong winds knocking the trees down on any part of our buildings. He is also responsible for securing anything that will fly in strong wind. Jim may assign one of our superintendents or hire a roofer each June 1st to inspect the roof covering and the perimeter flashing at all MJW offices. This would include cleaning roof drains, gutters and downspouts.

The “Front Line Response Connex” must be inspected and adequate supplies must be ready so that when a hurricane does hit in an area represented by Milton J. Wood, we can prepare to send a Front Line Response Team into the area to assist our clients as soon as it is safe to do so.

Project Managers must contact clients and get Post Hurricane Support Agreements signed so the Nucleus Team can begin planning travel routes into the strike zone. Depending on the number of PHS agreements, the purchase of additional satellite phones may be necessary.

2011 TEAM RESPONSIBILITIES

Our program consists of several teams, each with its own responsibilities before, during and after the hurricane makes landfall. Past experience has taught us that although the media is entertaining, they are not always accurate or reliable. It is therefore critical that we have up to the minute, accurate information as to when and where the hurricane may make landfall. Although we don't want to waste resources, we don't want to wait until the last minute and be unable to respond. In order to respond accordingly we will utilize the following four (4) hurricane preparedness conditions or degrees of warning. These four conditions are consistent with Civil Defense and National Weather Service Advisory (NWSA) warning levels.

Condition IV: Tropical disturbance is developing. It **May** pose a risk to Milton J. Wood's or a PHS Client's business. Clients that have signed a hurricane agreements, are to be contacted **96 hours** before a major tropical storm or hurricane is predicted by NWSA to make landfall. Clients must provide authorization to enact the agreement 92 hours prior to landfall.

Condition III NWSA indicates that a hurricane **MAY** strike an area that could impact



- Standby Milton J. Wood Company or a PHS Client's business within **72 hours**.
- Condition II Ready Alert NWSA indicate that a hurricane **will probably** strike in an area and has the potential of serious damage to Milton J. Wood Company or a PHS Client's business within **48 hours**.
- Condition I National Weather Service Advisories indicate that a hurricane **WILL** strike in the area within **24 hours**.

Hurricane Nucleus Team

The Nucleus Team's responsibility is to monitor all possible hurricane activity and notify the Management Team when it is probable that a hurricane will hit any area covered by this plan. The Nucleus Team will be responsible for listening to the weather and monitoring current hurricane conditions. It is important when storms threaten any of our areas that someone be responsible for keeping everyone abreast of weather developments.

Condition IV: *(Tropical disturbance is developing and could affect covered areas)*

- Determine the seriousness of hurricane conditions and inform our teammates of pertinent weather developments.
- Work closely with the Procurement Team to ensure adequate supplies are available when needed.
- Contact partnering clients for authorization to procure satellite phones, phone service and determine the pre hurricane location of the connex.

Condition III *(Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs)*

- Establish the projected "Strike Zone" and contact Milton J. Wood Management Team for the implementation of the action plan.

Condition II *(Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs)*

- Begin the phone matrix notification process. Pass on information as to the "Strike Zone" determination and necessary action plan.

Condition I *(Hurricane will stike a covered area within 24 hours)*

- Assist the Front Line Response Team in the mobilization of additional resource teams, equipment or supplies

Post Landfall

- Monitor weather and begin Contact Matrix as soon as it becomes safe for employees to return to their homes and work.

Contact Matrix System Activation:

The Nucleus Team will contact the Project Managers and Superintendents affected by the storm. The Project Managers and Superintendents will contact clients, subcontractors and general foremen if affected by the storm. The general foremen



will contact all crew members who may be affected by the storm. (See *Contact Matrix*, pg. 26-29 to determine who you need to notify, if necessary.)

The Nucleus Team will also contact Area Managers outside the “Strike Zone” and advise them that additional manpower and subcontract services may be needed.

Management Team

The Management Team is made up of Executive Company Members and has the ultimate responsibility for the implementation of this program. The Management Team will meet before May 15th, review the current program, suggest changes, and set the pace for the up-coming year.

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- The Management Team will designate the boundaries of the “Strike Zone” and choose which Front Line Response Team will be put on standby to respond to our clients needs as soon as it is safe to do so.
- The Management Team will contact the Area Manager(s) in the potential “Strike Zone” and advise them to contact PHS contracted clients and assure them we are ready to respond.

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs*)

- The Management Team will contact the Procurement Team to move the Response Trailer to a safe location.
- The Management Team will contact the chosen Front Line Team Leader and advise him to prepare his team.

Post Landfall

- Support Front Line Response Team, send manpower, equipment, subcontractors, and supplies to the team as requested.

Procurement Team

The Procurement Team’s responsibility is to maintain adequate support resources and keep the required Emergency Hurricane Inventory ready to go at a moment’s notice. A connex equipped with all the items listed on the equipment list will be maintained in an inland area location ready for immediate deployment throughout the hurricane season. The Procurement Team will be responsible for:

Condition IV (*Tropical disturbance is developing and could affect covered areas*)

- Ensuring adequate supplies are available to support the Front Line Response Team within 72 hours notice.
- Ensuring all subcontractor information is accurate and current.

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- Providing information on availability of hard to locate supplies and equipment that may be needed by our response teams.
- Developing a plan for getting these supplies to the needed areas.



- Providing all affected jobsites with current phone lists and job information.

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs*)

- The Procurement Team will make preparation for a generator hook-up so the telephones may be operational depending on the availability of telephone company service. This combined with the Nextel system should put us in good shape communications wise.
- Inspecting the Response Connex and making sure all supplies and travel clearance documentation is in the trailer.
- Locating the connex to a safe location.
- The Procurement Team will be responsible for ensuring enough plywood is available and on-hand when needed.
- Ensuring the Front Line Response Team has adequate communication equipment.
- Ensuring all computers are backed up and back ups are stored in a safe location.

Condition I (*Hurricane will strike a covered area within 24 hours*)

- Keep a list of secured jobsites and provide a copy of this list to the Management Team and Nucleus Team.

Divisions Team

The Divisions Team will consist of all Area Managers.

Members inside the Strike Zone will:

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- Insure hurricane preparedness procedures are completed for all jobsite and offices in their area
- Contact the PHS Clients and verify the contact information is correct

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike covered area within 48 hrs.*)

- Insure that all contact lists have been sent to the management team

Members that are outside the Strike Zone will assist the management team in securing equipment, supplies and labor for the Front Line Response Team if needed.

Front Line Response Team

The Front Line Response Team will consist of few superintendents outside of the Strike Zone. Management will select a Front Line Response Team Leader based on the location of the strike zone and the severity of the hurricane.. As soon as it is safe, he and his team will travel to the Strike Zone equipped with enough material to sustain a small crew for four days.

Responsibilities of the Front Line Response Team include:



Post Hurricane

- Survey the damage to the PHS Client's Property.
- Establish priorities and procedures for the restoration with first consideration being given to fallen power lines, openings resulting from storm damage, etc.
- Perform emergency repairs and assess damage at participating Client's properties.
- Communicate any additional support needs through the Management Team and/or Nucleus Team.
- Obtain additional manpower, subcontractors, equipment, supplies, etc., through the Management Team.
- Notify the Nucleus Team when it safe for evacuated employees to return to their homes.

Job Site Supervisors Inside the Strike Zone

Job Site Supervisors inside the Strike Zone must make sure all hurricane preparedness items are completed and all contact information has been obtained before leaving the jobsite. He will send his contact information, his crew's contact information, any subcontractor's contact information to the Nucleus Team so that they can be notified when they are to report back to work.

Jobsite Supervisors Outside the Strike Zone

Job Site Supervisors outside the Strike Zone should contact their Area Leader and advise him of any manpower, supplies or equipment that is available, if needed.

- Ensure Communication Resource is available for the Front Line Response Team.

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- Print and distribute current work order log.
- Contact subcontractors to evaluate manpower available to MJW.

Condition II

- Contact rental company to have generator ready for delivery and pickup
- Procurement Team keeps a running list of secured job sites
- Check all flashlights.
- Check secondary phone system.
- Fill all empty gas cans and vehicles.
- Stock up water supply at office.

Condition I (*Hurricane will strike a covered area within 24 hours*)

- Network Administrator to backup and secure network system. Back up tapes to be given to Annmarie Nemeth and Zarko Ognjenovic.
- If applicable, the Network Administrator will secure all equipment. Upon issuance of a hurricane watch, he will make a back up of our network and remove it from the site. Upon issuance of a hurricane warning, he will make sure all equipment is properly shut down and covered with trash bags. All computers in the center workstations will be moved to the safest location.
- If applicable, the Chief Financial Officer will be responsible for securing any financial records or documents.
- Board up MJW office(s).
- Secure MJW building when departing.



Nucleus Team Checklist

Condition IV

- Monitor tropical storms, depressions for possible hurricane exposure.
- Assist Procurement Team to ensure adequate supplies are available.

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- Advise Management Team when possible hurricane or tropical storm

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs*)

- Advise all jobsites in “Strike Zone” to secure jobsite and begin personal preparation for a hurricane.
- Advise all Project Managers and Superintendents to review their procedures and gather any additional materials they may need.
- Once the plan is activated, begin Contact Matrix to all “Strike Zone” Team Members
- Contact Jack Deshisky and check if he needs assistance with properties.

Condition I (*Hurricane will strike a covered area within 24 hours*)

- Contact Divisions Team Members Outside the Strike Zone and request available manpower, equipment, and subcontractor lists.

Post Hurricane

- Monitor weather conditions and initiate the Contact Matrix when conditions are safe for employees to return to their homes and work.



Divisions Team Checklist (Inside the Strike Zone)

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- Contact clients and advise Milton J. Wood will be ready to respond if needed. Verify contact information.

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs*)

- Contact all vendors/suppliers to see if they can help Front Line Response Team.
- Distribute one time use cameras to each affected job site.
- Check secondary phone system.
- Check all flashlights.
- Stock up water supply at office.
- Fill all empty gas cans and vehicles
- Contact subcontractors to evaluate manpower available to MJW.
- Contact affected superintendents and project managers to ensure jobsites are secure and contact lists have been completed.

Condition I (*Hurricane will strike a covered area within 24 hours*)

- Secure MJW building when departing. Advise Procurement Team building is secured.

Divisions Team Checklist (Outside the Strike Zone)

Condition IV

Team members outside the Strike Zone will be asked to report available manpower, equipment, supplies and possible subcontractors that can be provided to the Front Line Response Team if needed. The contact information is to be submitted to the Management Team as soon as possible.



JOB SITE SUPERINTENDENT CHECKLIST (JOBS IN STRIKE ZONE)

Condition III (*Hurricane may strike covered area within 72 hrs*)

- ❑ Prepare phone lists.
- ❑ Get home phone numbers of all Milton J. Wood Hurricane Team members involved with the project. Give a copy of the list to client representative.
- ❑ Make arrangements for extra plywood to cover windows and doors.
- ❑ Obtain extra Visqueen for use after the storm.
- ❑ Prepare a contact list for employees and give them a contact number to call when the storm has passed.
- ❑ Obtain emergency plans from local Fire Department, Civil Defense or any other agency. Review plan with client representative, team members and subs.
- ❑ Check first-aid supplies.
- ❑ Prepare a contact list of subcontractors and give them a contact number to call when the storm has passed.
- ❑ Locate portable generators to be readily available for use if required. Also make arrangements for a large capacity water pump.

Condition II (*Hurricane will probably strike a covered area within 48 hrs*)

- ❑ Secure a camera and shoot 30 – 50 photos of jobsite interior and exterior. This will aid in documenting damages after the storm and show what precautions were taken to prevent damage.
- ❑ Charge all Nextel batteries.
- ❑ Secure the trailers with ½” cable in at least three places. Use 55-gallon drums filled with concrete. Remove all important documents and equipment.
- ❑ Secure all loose materials at the job site. Band all loose materials with metal straps. Secure banded materials to floors and/or columns.
- ❑ Make sure all equipment at the site is full of fuel. Fill all fuel cans at the job site. Fill all vehicles.
- ❑ Cranes – Boom crane down if possible. If not possible, fully extend and set all outriggers. **DO NOT SECURE THE CRANE WITH ANY BOOM ATTACHMENTS. USE ONLY MAIN BOOM!!!!**
- ❑ Get all heavy equipment to high ground. Lower all accessories and set the parking brake

Condition I (*Hurricane will strike a covered area within 24 hours*)

- ❑ Computers. Move computers to the safest location in the jobsite trailer away from windows and off floor and cover with plastic
- ❑ File cabinets. Move important files to a secure location that is safe from water damage.
- ❑ Shut off all electricity at the main breakers.
- ❑ Shut off main water valve for the trailer, if applicable.
- ❑ Tape or board up windows.
- ❑ Secure all compressed gases in racks, with storage caps securely in place.



- ❑ Broom clean the entire project inside and outside the building.
- ❑ Remove all trash from the job site prior to the storm.
- ❑ Communication – Ensure that each employee is notified of when they are to report back to work, who if anyone is on-call, and that all necessary phone numbers are distributed.
- ❑ Ensure that each jobsite is secured in ample time for employees to ensure the safety of their families. Strike Zone Employees consists of those living and/or working within a 50 mile radius of the projected hurricane land fall area
- ❑ Advise Procurement Team when jobsite is secured.
- ❑ Send copy of contact lists to Nucleus Team and Procurement Team.



Front Line Response Team Checklist

Condition I

Response Connex

Verify all supplies and equipment are in the Connex.
Verify communication system is adequate
Verify Travel Clearance Documents are in Connex..
Verify safety of travel route with Nucleus Team
Verify Contact Numbers are in the Connex.
Verify copy of Post Hurricane Support Agreements are in Connex.

Post Hurricane

Assess Damage

Check nearest MJW office and assess damage. Determine where operations will be set up, Jacksonville office, Lakeland office, Brunswick office or out of connex.
Evaluate phone system.
Evaluate computer network system.
Hook up generator if necessary.
Respond to PHS partners and assess damage, contact Management Team with additional man-hour, subcontractor, and equipment needs.

Manpower

Assess MJW labor force through the Management Team and assign to the most critical areas until under control.
Secure subcontractor services through the Management Team.
Notify the Nucleus Team as soon as it is safe for evacuated employees to return to the area.
Evaluate manpower available to MJW. If subs are on job sites without damage, they may be reassigned on a temporary basis to work in the critical area.



EMERGENCY CALL LIST
